Academic Department

E A Holistic, Child-Centred Approach to Learning

The Academic Department at KSV is unwavering in its commitment to providing inclusive, value-based education that caters to students' individual needs, academically and emotionally. Our approach, deeply rooted in empathy, flexibility, and curiosity, is designed to help all students, especially those from disadvantaged backgrounds, thrive at their own pace.

Under the dynamic leadership of our new Head of Department, Rupali Avargerimath, this year has been marked by significant achievements. We have renewed our focus on foundational learning, literacy and numeracy, continuous assessment, and teacher development. Classrooms across standards have embraced activity-based learning, peer collaboration, and differentiated instruction, improving student outcomes.

Classroom Innovations & Pedagogy

KSV teachers continue to integrate:

- Experiential learning through storytelling, project work, and nature walks.
- Digital Learning uses YouTube, Khan Academy, and Google Classroom in upper grades.
- Language Support through remedial reading sessions, word walls, and library corners.
- Assessment for learning, including rubrics, learning trackers and student portfolios.

This year, a new initiative called "Discovery and Development" was introduced for students. This initiative combines life skills, citizenship, and academic exploration. These weekly sessions covered personal finance, values education, general knowledge, and career pathways.

Academic Assessment & SSLC Results

KSV continues to use a continuous assessment model for students from 1st to 7th Standard, supported by regular feedback and individualised interventions. For classes 8 to 10, internal examinations prepare students for the SSLC board exams.

2024-25 Academic Highlights:

- 81% pass rate in SSLC (10th Standard Board Exams)
- 16 students appeared for the exam
- Highest score: Bhishtavva Ratolli scored the highest with 94%
- Bhishtavva achieved 100% in SST, & 99% in Kannada & English
- 25% of the graduates scored above 80%
- All SSLC graduates were admitted to PU College or vocational training.
- 100% of 8th & 9th grade students passed internal exams
- 72 total higher education students supported in 2024-25





Foundational Learning & Remedial Support

KSV placed special emphasis this year on strengthening early literacy and numeracy across the 1st to 4th Standards, with the following strategies:

- Dedicated Foundational Literacy sessions using multilingual storybooks
- Introduction of numeracy kits with games and manipulatives.
- Early intervention and extra help for students with learning gaps.
- Diagnostic assessments to track reading and arithmetic progress.

These efforts are part of KSV's long-term strategy and align perfectly with the National Education Policy (NEP 2020) goals, particularly ensuring universal foundational learning by Grade 3.

Enriching Discovery & Development Sessions

KSV's Discovery & Development sessions are an ongoing opportunity for students to explore new areas of knowledge and develop essential life skills. Their continuous nature ensures that students have a consistent platform for growth and learning, instilling confidence in their progress.

The sessions have been a diverse mix of activities, including:

- Visits to local universities
- Visits to local sustainable farms
- · Sessions on road and traffic safety
- Sessions on plant grafting
- Designed clothes from waste material
- Workshops on self-defence
- Gained insight into journalism

Performing Arts Department

Music, Expression, and Cultural Identity

The Performing Arts Department is not just a part of KSV; it's at the heart of our mission to nurture the whole child. We believe access to Indian classical music and the dramatic arts fosters creativity, confidence, self-discipline, and deep cultural pride. This is a mission we all share and strive to uphold.

This year, KSV has again demonstrated its commitment to providing a comprehensive arts education. We have continued to offer intensive daily training in vocal music, tabla, sitar, violin, and drama, and we have provided regular performance opportunities for all students from the 1st to 10th standard.

Each day at KSV begins with sadhana, a quiet, focused, and individual practice that sets the tone for the day. This is followed by structured Performing Arts classes from 8:30 to 11:15 AM, led by dedicated teachers who are also working artists and practitioners. This routine ensures that our students start their day with a sense of purpose and focus.



Elementary & Regular Programs

Elementary Classes (1st-4th Standard)

Through the joy of songs, games, and interactive lessons, students are introduced to Hindustani classical vocal music, folk dance, rhythm, and creative movement. These formative years build appreciation and confidence, fostering a sense of excitement and engagement in the learning process.

Regular Classes (5th-10th Standard)

Older students specialise in one or two disciplines (Vocal, Tabla, Sitar, Violin, Drama). They deepen their skills through:

- · Weekly assessments
- Evening practice sessions
- Ensemble rehearsals
- Feedback-based learning
- Participation in internal and external performances



Student Welfare Department

M Creating a Safe, Nurturing, and Empowering Residential Environment

At KSV, student welfare is at the core of everything we do. In a fully residential setting, we don't just provide care; we create a home where children feel safe, respected, and supported every hour of the day, ensuring their safety and well-being round the clock.

The Student Welfare Department plays a pivotal role in students' lives, overseeing their emotional well-being, physical health, personal development, hygiene, and discipline. With a dedicated team of wardens, nurses, and coordinators, we provide holistic support that extends beyond the classroom.

Staffing & Leadership

- Warden Coordinators: Sushma Yadgeri & Jyotiba Kademani
- 12 full-time hostel wardens
- An on-campus nurse providing daily health care



■ Hostel Life

KSV currently operates six hostels:

- Divided by gender and age group: Small, Medium, and Big
- Each hostel houses approximately. 25 students
- Two wardens are assigned to each hostel, ensuring 24/7 adult supervision and emotional support.
- Daily routines include morning hygiene, evening study, reflective check-ins, and value-based guidance.

This year, hostel routines were strengthened through the introduction of:

- Weekly hostel meetings to build a stronger sense of community.
- Circle of Gratitude to encourage feedback and positivity.



Health, Hygiene, and Nutrition

- Over 100,000 meals served this year, all prepared by our committed kitchen staff, who diligently follow KSV's nutrition guidelines and use local ingredients. Students received a diverse range of balanced South Indian vegetarian meals, emphasising pulses, millets, eggs (twice a week), fruits, and green vegetables, ensuring a healthy and varied diet.
- A new laundry room, a significant addition this year, was constructed near the
 hostels (thanks to the <u>PwC</u> funding). This facility has greatly improved the
 living conditions of our students, ensuring they have clean and hygienic
 clothes at all times.
- Sanitary pad kits were distributed to all adolescent girls.

The infirmary remains equipped for basic first aid, minor illness treatment, and emergency triage. For more serious conditions, our referral system with local hospitals ensures access to free or low-cost care.

Emotional & Mental Wellbeing

As students navigate adolescence and the demands of residential schooling, emotional well-being remains a significant priority. This year, KSV introduced:

- Wellness Workshops focused on managing anger, sadness, anxiety, and relationships
- One-on-one student counselling, both internally and with external therapists
- Mindfulness and breathing exercises before major exams and competitions



∜ Health & Safety Highlights

- Regular Body Mass Index checks are completed for all students
- Students received health kits with soap, toothbrushes, combs, and undergarments.
- Dental hygiene awareness activities led by international volunteers
- Kitchen hygiene training was conducted for the student kitchen team.


Kaveri Nayak - A Tale of Dedication and Success

- · Easy access clothes sorting area

This facility has improved hygiene, reduced water usage, and created a cleaner, more organised space for hostel life.

& Campus Sustainability Initiatives

- Installation of water-saving nozzles in select washrooms






"Green Time" Student Sessions

Pridging Worlds Through Service

Kalkeri Sangeet Vidyalaya has always welcomed volunteers as an integral part of its ecosystem — not only for their support but also for their perspectives, friendships, and inspiration.

After a cautious relaunch post-pandemic, the Volunteer Programme has continued and grown steadily in 2024–25. This growth is a testament to our collective resilience and commitment, enriching students' lives and strengthening KSV's international and intercultural connections.

This year, 27 volunteers from France, Germany, Canada, and India spent between one month and one year at KSV, contributing in tangible ways to academics, health care, fundraising, communications, hostel life, and performing arts. For instance, they helped with academic tutoring, organised health awareness camps, and conducted cultural exchange programs.

M Integration with Campus Life

Volunteers lived on-site, sharing meals and engaging in community life while being paired with staff mentors. They received orientation on cultural context, local customs, school values and policies, Kannada survival language sessions, and child protection and safety procedures. This immersive approach built trust, promoted cross-cultural understanding, and fostered genuine relationships with both students and staff.



M Roles & Contributions

Volunteers were involved in:

Academic Support

➤ English language instruction, reading circles, remedial tutoring, and higher-level exam preparation.

Performing Arts Mentorship

➤ Coaching in vocal practice, rhythm training, movement, and exposure to global musical styles.

Health & Hygiene

➤ On-campus nurse support, wellness education, dental hygiene sessions, and student health check-ins.

Hostel & Student Life

➤ Organising evening games, arts & crafts sessions, and individual mentorship for students needing extra emotional support.

Administrative & Outreach Work

➤ Support with photography, documentation, newsletters, fundraising, and communications.

Although too short for my liking, my time at KSV will remain a milestone in my personal and professional journey.

In this environment, I first witnessed the real impact of this organisation. Beyond providing academic education and Hindustani music, KSV offers young people a caring environment and the chance to enjoy a childhood filled with precious memories.

I also had the chance to discover Indian culture from a unique perspective. I was immersed in daily customs—through food, festivities, spirituality, and warm human connections. This closeness helped me better understand the richness and complexity of the local culture.

Finally, the experience was highly professional. I put my branding and communication skills into practice while facilitating genuine knowledge transfer. This allowed me to contribute to KSV's mission and shape my own vision of communication's social role.

Moving Toward Longer-Term Engagement

In 2024–25, KSV began transitioning to a longer-term volunteer engagement model, aiming to:

- Prioritise volunteers who can stay for 12 months
- Offer more structured onboarding and mentorship.
- Focus on skills-based placements that align with school priorities.

This shift is helping ensure continuity for students and deepening the impact of volunteer contributions.

Fundraising & Sponsorship

Empowering Education Through Generosity

Fundraising at KSV is about financial sustainability and building a community of belief. Each donor, each sponsor, each supporter represents a vote of confidence in our mission to provide free, high-quality education to children from marginalised backgrounds.

The 2024-25 academic year saw growth in donor engagement, the continuation of long-term institutional partnerships, and several impactful fundraising campaigns — each one helping us reach more children and offer more opportunities.

The Child Sponsorship Programme

Our <u>Child Sponsorship Programme</u> remains KSV's most reliable and sustainable core funding source. The model is simple but powerful: each student is matched with three committed sponsors, who receive regular updates and corresponding opportunities.

11 2024-25 Snapshot

- 450 active sponsors
- 98 new sponsors joined this year
- 91% retention rate
- Sponsors from India, France, Canada, the Germany, the USA, and beyond
- Over 43% of KSV's funding came from sponsorships.





* Sponsorship Campaign

From February 2025 to May 2025, we ran a sponsorship campaign, during which we recruited 75 new child sponsors.

Each year, we welcome new students into our community. Last year, 30 endearing students – 15 in 1st Std and 15 in other standards – began their enriching journey with us. To ensure our sustainability, we launched a sponsorship campaign to meet the educational needs of each child. While our goal was to ensure 90 sponsors, we feel humbled and encouraged by the 75 kind-hearted individuals who joined us on this journey.

⋈ Sponsor Communication

This year, we enhanced sponsor engagement by:

- Exchanging letters where children write to their sponsors
- Sending four seasonal newsletters
- Including video clips and performance
- Hosting occasional online interactions for sponsors


